


Kansas Quick hitter (7)



Kansas Quick Hitter vs. Man Defense

This play takes a small bit of patience and a lot of work on timing and footwork.

#5 breaks out to the wing area to receive the entry pass from #1. #3 cuts to the basket then out to the ball side corner area. #2 cuts down to the block while #4 sets up for a down screen.



Kansas Quick Hitter vs. Man Defense

#5 takes the ball on the dribble towards the FT line elbow area. As #5 picks up his dribble, he turns and looks for #3 cutting towards the ball and then to the basket on the ball fake from #5. The key with the timing is the dribble pick-up from #5. As #5 picks up his dribble, #3 should start his movement towards #5. The dribble pick up and #3's movement towards the ball with trigger the defender to "tighten up" knowing that #5 does not have his dribble. Then the timing of the ball fake from #5 and the back door cut from #3 is something that has to be practiced.

#2 on the right side waits for this to develop. As the back door is happening, #4 and #1 are now down screening for #2, taking away any helpside defenders. It is important that they do not start this action until just after #5 has picked up his dribble.
