
## Kansas Set play vs. zone (4)




Kansas Set Play vs. Zone

Kansas had great success against Michigan State with this play. They got the ball on the block at least three times during the game for an easy shot inside.

Here it is...


#1 passes to #2 on the wing. #5 follows the ball to the ball side high post.



Kansas Set Play vs. Zone

#2 passes the ball back to #1 on top and then cuts across the floor to the opposite low block.

#1 passes the ball to #3 on the opposite wing.



Kansas Set Play vs. Zone

#3 now puts the ball on the floor towards the middle of the floor. #1 slides over and receives a pass from #3. #4 and #5 set a double screen for #2 breaking to the ball side corner.





Kansas Set Play vs. Zone

As #2 breaks off the double screen, #5 steps in and sets a screen on the inside defender, while #4 steps over the top and posts up for the ball and entry pass from #1.

This is a great play because it forces the defenders to make decisions on who they are going to cover. Somebody has to go with #2 to the corner. Someone has to guard the ball #1. This leaves one defender inside vs. #4 and #5. Someone has to be open, especially inside.

Rarely will you see the back side opposite low defender come across and help on this play. If so, the back side is open and you could have #3 fade to the back side for a quick shot.
