

North Carolina Early Offense


Kind of a new rinkle in the standard early offense from North Carolina and Roy Williams.

#1 brings the ball up the right side. #4 trails the play on top.

#1 reverses the ball to #4 while #5 slides across the lane looking for a pass out top from #4. If he doesn't get the ball he continues on across the lane.

#4 then passes to #3.






North Carolina Early Offense

#2 moves into the lane for the back screen on the player who just passed to #3, which would be the perimeter post player #4.

#4 uses the back screen and looks for the lob pass to the rim from #3.

Normally, from here #2 would step out and they would get into a set play or run their passing game or motion offense.





North Carolina Early Offense

Here is the little twist we noticed them using.

Instead of #2 popping out, he gets a back screen from the post player on the ball side block, #5.

#3 looks to hit #2 cutting to the low block. If it is not there, he can center the ball on top to #5 who has just stepped out after back screening for #2.

From here they will either call a set play or run their motion offense / passing game.
